

about how we may get more enjoyable and productive moments with our "crafts". One that I'm pondering is a "Sailing Tip of the Month". While it currently is brainstorming idea, I'd like your feedback on its value. For this month, here's an idea on how to simply and effectively coil your excess dock line. Sometimes called a "Flemish Flake", or simply a "coil", it renders a neat and easy-to-uncoil method of line handling. Dock surfaces tend to be rough to prevent slipping, particularly here at CLM. Nothing, including dock lines slide easily on these surfaces and trying to coil your line neatly can be a royal pain. So, here's a tip to allow you to easily and neatly coil your excess dock line. Take a plastic cutting board, removable ice chest top or a piece of cardboard and lay it near your dock cleat. Coil your dock line on the smooth surface you've provided. When you've completed your

"coil", carefully slide it off your board, positioning it next to the cleat.

So whatever your sailing wishes are, come on down to the lake and enjoy our "passion for sailing"!
