suitable fire extinguishers. If you have any questions, we maintain a supply of safety pamphlets in our clubhouse to the left of the main entrance. Reviewing the "Rules of the Road", whether "sailboat on sailboat" or "sailboat on powerboat", etc. Good advice for all boaters!

In my June article, I addressed "Main sheet and Traveler" techniques, compliments of Ullman Sails. This month, I'll continue sharing their tips for controlling "Leach tension": "More leech tension closes the leech which allows the boat to point higher. But when you trim past the point of stall, where the top telltale (three batten main) or second telltale down (four batten main) stops flying, the boat will start to slow down. As the boat begins to be overpowered, the traveler should be eased down to reduce weather helm and keep the boat at less than 25 degrees of heel. As the traveler is eased, you will begin to develop back-wind. This is not a problem. In puffy wind, the traveler should be played aggressively. Choppy water usually requires a little more twist in the leech than flat

water so you should pull the traveler higher and ease the sheet".

Before closing, I'd like to praise our local Daysailer "Guadalupe" Fleet #135 which was commissioned last year. Their goal is to encourage, support, challenge and experience together the Day Sailer adventure. In this past year they've grown to six skipper/owners! They are; John Alesch, David Oates, Calvin Jones, Denise Lasater, Fred Thompson and Anibal Diogenes, their newest member. Congratulations to all of you!
